


1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?






3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?




4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as






5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.




6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?






7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.




8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.






9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.







11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you




12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications



13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.




14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help to overcome them






15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.




16. The institute/teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.






17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities




18. Efforts are made by the institution/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.






19. What percentage of the teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projectors, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.

STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY FEEDBACK ANALYSIS

- 1. Most of the students agreed that the syllabus was consistently covered on time in class. They found their teachers well-prepared and praised their effective communication. Students described the teaching approach as commendable, with many appreciating the fairness of the internal evaluation process.
- 2. Students noted that their assignment performance is regularly discussed, creating a culture of continuous feedback. They also recognized the institute's active efforts to promote internships, and field visit opportunities, which enhance their academic and professional growth.
- 3. Most students felt that the institution's teaching and mentoring practices contribute significantly to their cognitive, social, and emotional development. They acknowledged the variety of opportunities for learning and growth offered by the institution. Teachers consistently communicate expected competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes.
- 4. The use of practical examples and applications by teachers was widely appreciated. Students felt that teachers recognize their strengths and challenge them accordingly, while also helping them address their weaknesses.
- 5. Students also appreciated the institution's engagement in monitoring and improving the teaching-learning process. However, they identified a need for more student-centric methods, such as experiential and participative learning, to further enrich their educational experiences.
- 6. Many students felt encouraged by teachers to participate in extracurricular activities. While efforts to develop soft skills, life skills, and employability were recognized, students felt that more could be done in this area.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT: STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

1. Syllabus Coverage:

Feedback: Many students agreed that the syllabus was consistently covered on time in class.
