INDEPENDENCE DAY

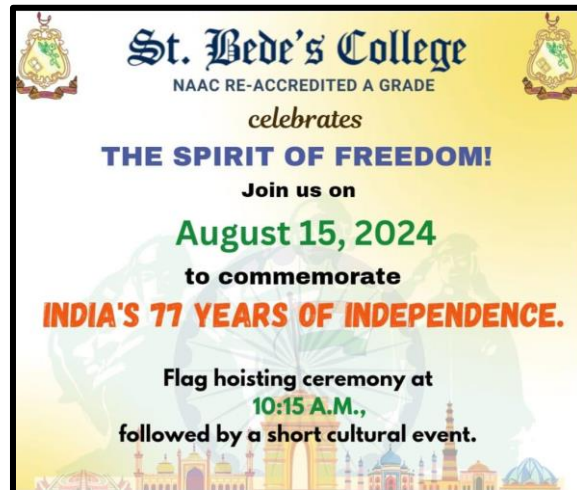
Objective: To decorate the auditorium for Independence Day celebration.

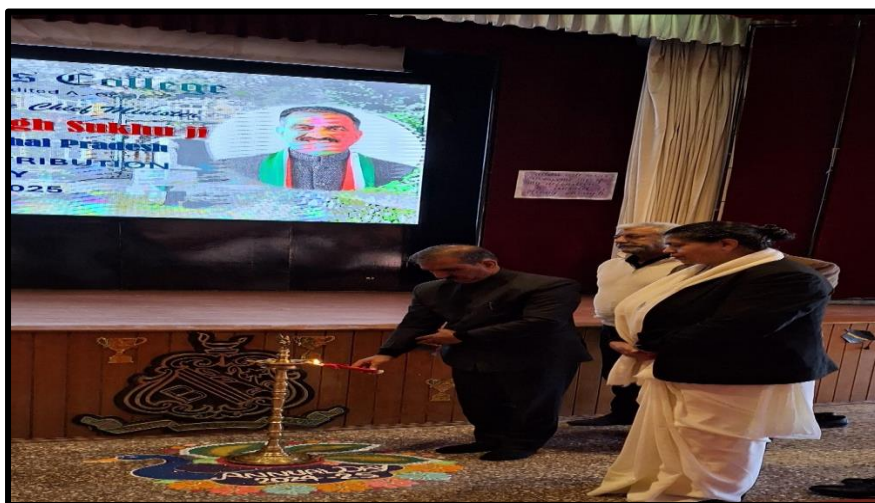

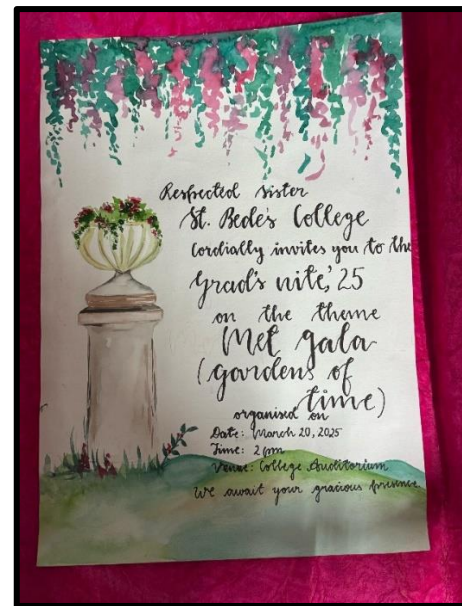
Outcome: The decoration was extremely well planned and extraordinarily done. It showcased the variety of styles of the members and their talent.
